### Section 504 Annual Notice

In accordance with the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 commonly known as § 504, the Scio School District hereby notifies disabled children and their parents of the School District duty under the Regulations to § 504.

The Scio School District shall provide a free appropriate public education to each qualified disabled child who resides in the School District regardless of the nature or severity of the disability. The Scio School District shall educate each qualified disabled child with children who are not disabled to the maximum extent appropriate to the needs of the disabled child, and shall also ensure that disabled children participate with non-disabled children in nonacademic and extra-curricular activities to the maximum extent appropriate. A disabled child shall be afforded an equal opportunity for participation in such services and activities.

The Scio School District shall provide disabled children an equal opportunity for participation in physical education courses, interscholastic, club or intramural athletics.

The Scio School District shall conduct pre-placement evaluations, and shall establish standards and procedures consistent with § 104.35 for the evaluation and placement of children who need or are believed to need special education or related services. Periodic reevaluation shall be conducted of children who have been provided special education or related services.

Placement decisions shall draw upon information from a variety of sources and shall be made by a group of persons knowledgeable about the child, the meaning of the evaluation data, and the placement options. The Scio School District shall establish and implement a system of procedural safeguards that includes notice, an opportunity for the parent to examine relevant records, an impartial hearing with the opportunity for participation by the parent and representation by counsel, and a review procedure.

### About Pesticides

School law requires the district maintain, on an annual basis, a list of parents who wish to receive advance notice of pesticide use at the school their child attends. To have your name included, a formal request must be submitted in writing. Forms can be obtained by contacting the school.



# **Principal's Corner**

Our school year is off to a great start! There is a wonderful atmosphere in our building. Our climate is one that promotes teaching and learning while providing an environment conducive to student success. As we continue our push to raise our expectations at SCS, I would like to commend our students, staff, and community who have embraced our "Committed to Excellence" motto. In this article you will see the testing results for the 2010-11 school year. Please read the notes that correspond with each chart. This information was presented at a September Board of Education meeting.

The chart **AT TOP RIGHT** reflects a four-year historical trend for our grades 3-8 testing program. During the summer of 2010, after the assessment data was collected, the NYS Education Department adjusted the cut (passing) score for the exams. This was done by NYSED because research showed that prior levels of passing on these exams were not an accurate predictor of future success on high school Regents and college entrance exams. New York State is currently moving to a new set of Common Core standards and a revised testing program.

The June Regents results are shown **AT RIGHT**. Passing is 65%. Percent mastery reflects the percentage of students scoring 85% or higher.

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


chrysalis. All three butterflies emerged from their chrysalids! We released them outside the school so they can fly south to warmer temperatures.
